## 26, 27, 28 April 2003

During the Great 400 Working in April 2002, the local Government suggested that a more broadly based event should be arranged at Sandstone Estates

in 2003. Although a substantial sponsorship was offered at the time, this did not materialise. Therefore the original event WWW (Wings, Wheels & Whistles)

was scaled down and is now called "The Sandstone Heritage Fair" which is due to take place in April. For the collector, enthusiast and visitor there will be

a feast of items from bygone eras on display. This is a show by exhibitors for exhibitors. The public are very welcome but the people who will get the most

out of this show will be those with a passion for preservation and for our country's transportation, steam and agricultural mechanical heritage.

## Sandstone Steam Railroad

The world-renowned 2-ft narrow gauge rail system will be in operation using up to seven locomotives. These are amongst the best preserved and most historically interesting 2-ft narrow gauge locomotives in daily use anywhere in the world. A large selection of passenger and freight wagons will be configured behind the different locomotives which will be working continuously.

Vintage Aircraft (strictly by invitation only)

An exciting collection of fifteen of South Africa's oldest vintage aircraft will be flying from the beautiful grass airstrip which nestles at the foot of the big Maluti Mountains. We are pleased to announce that retired Brig Genl Jan Delport (SAAF), cell no 082 491 4316, has accepted the job of co-ordinating this exciting addition to the event.

## Vintage Cars and Motorbikes

Any vintage or classic vehicle is welcome. Whether you are part of a club and would like to arrange a road run to the event, participate and then go

home, or whether you are just an individual with a cherished old car that you have owned for many years or perhaps recently rebuilt, we would love

to see you on the site. We encourage the vintage car and motorcycle movement to participate in this event. Many highly successful events have been

held at Sandstone Estates in the past but with a strong agricultural bias. Now we would like to broaden this scope to cover one of the most popular

aspects of mechanical preservation., i.e. cars and motorbikes.

will be working with tractors dating back to 1909. Traction engines, portable agricultural engines, threshing machines... the list is too great to even

begin to describe. In line with our philosophy these machines will be working and moving just as they did at the Great 400 in April last year.

## **General Information**

Consistent with the most successful country fairs, traction engine rallies and similar events

around the world, we have decided that our programme will be extremely informal. We expect owners of machines to drive them, operate them, stop them when they want to, ride thetrain, participate in preservation activities that they would not normally experience or maybe just sit contentedly alongside your machine and have a braai. The facilities on the site have been enhanced in such a way that there is no central event and no formal competitions. There is no bias towards any particular manufacturer since we have decided to decline all sponsorships in the interests of maintaining a non-commercial country fair atmosphere. However clubs are free to arrange their own

events or competitions.

## **Registration Form**

We have attached a new registration form so that we can develop a good idea of who might be there. We will have the necessary facilities available.

Our main camp ground has been expanded. We have a unique steam operated hot water supply at the ablution block which we are told can never run

out of hot water, and many, many more toilets have been placed on site. In addition, many of our big modern farm buildings have recently been brick

paved and will provide excellent accommodation for many of the displays, exhibits, crafts and collections of items that people love to share with fellow

preservationists. Jannie du Toit's (Gordon's Bay) complete collection of vintage and classic International Harvester tractors will be on display in a special

building. This is just one example of what will be available.

#### Last Remarks

This will be a fun show on a big site with excellent rights of way for trains, aircraft, cars, tractors, oxen and steam traction engines.

The message is "Lets get together and have a great weekend". If your machine could speak it would already be telling you that it will disown you

if you do not book now. There are many, many more surprises in store for those that wish to join with their fellow preservationists and become

part of the heartbeat of the Sandstone Heritage Fair, April 2003.
